My recent Winlink email experience, K9KMV



I know that many of you have already used, tested, and successfully sent/received emails via Winlink, but for me it is a relatively recent addition to the capabilities at my station.

I first set Winlink up in March 2021, but other than sending a couple of emails to make sure it worked, I did not find much use for it other than having the knowledge that it would be available if needed.

A fellow club member, Tim KD9LAI, recently mentioned to me that there is a weekly 'Winlink Wednesday' net that is run by KW6GB in Virginia. The purpose of this net is for amateur radio operators to get regular practice using Winlink email so that if it is needed for an emergency, your skills are already tuned and ready for use.

So, with that information, I went to the Winlink Wednesday website and followed the net check -in instructions.

To illustrate the importance of practice, I had forgotten one of the key steps in setting up my software/radio connection, and it took me some time to figure out what I was doing wrong (I needed my 7300 to be in USB-D mode). If this had been a real emergency situation, I would have lost valuable time and may even have given up. Now, I have learnt from that experience and know what to do to make it work first time.

I have checked in to this net 3 times now, and I am glad that I now have a reason to fire up the Winlink Express software on a more regular basis. I am now familiar with the setup requirements and can get emails out in a timely manner. Learning which gateways and bands to use at different times of day is also very useful.

For me personally, with there being so many aspects of amateur radio to not only learn, but to be comfortable and proficient with, I think keeping a good level of familiarity with our radio skills is very important.

Kent W9KAO reports hearing inconsistent static originating at the Barrington Road installation. Source of noise is not yet known but he noted our professional Station Master 2M antenna on top of the water tower is >25 years old. Cursory checks of the duplexer connections in the past to determine if they may or may not play a role have been conducted periodically but not recently. The current thought is the club may invest in professional equipment rental/service to thoroughly analyze our antenna system and even plan for the eventual heavy expense of renewing the antenna if needed. Expense will be high because the ~20-foot tall antenna is mounted on the top of the convex tank top with only menial catwalk and safety anchoring. Even a qualified installer will have difficulty swinging such a tall assembly vertically and holding in place for mounting all the while working within the limited movement of a safety harness!

Maybe a club member has a drone to help take a visual survey of the antenna's exterior fiberglass shell to look for anything obvious before we consider renewal.

Special Celebration Tonight



Mel Luxenberg W9FRT is newly anointed Member Emeritus.

During a previous Board Meeting, John Zietlow K9WIC suggested our club celebrate Mel's ~40 Year contribution to the club. John Douglas KD9KSH arranged for refreshments, Dennis C. Calvey KD9HIK brought his professional photography equipment, and our club presented Mel his Certificate of Appreciation (photograph is also planned to be posted on www.n9rjv.org website shortly). Roberto WA9E suggested we craft an appreciation certificate and also provided key support in contacting family members to arrange Mel's travel to our meeting tonight.

Mel related his radio background to the group including responsibility for the antenna farm of O'Hare Field during his years with the FAA. Earlier, Mel's WWII wartime service on Destroyer USS Sumpter (later on USS Calloway) was also explained briefly: Being a licensed Ham Operator before the war, Mel was now responsible for the ship's radio shack. While not in actual battle at the time, a wayward sailor entered the highly secure area without authority, mistakenly kicked-over an open can of paint and in a fit of fury, Mel drew his 1911 sidearm to throw the man out. Mel subsequently had to stand trial at Captain's Mast and was convicted / sentenced to shore leave denial for 10 days (they were at sea for at least 20 more days) because he did not kill the offender. Mel explained Military protocol requires any situation where arms are drawn to conclude in elimination of the threat.

He's also the only person we know who climbed the WGN transmit tower to re-lamp the clearance lighting and lived to tell us about it.

EMCOMM:

John Zietlow K9WIC reported there is concerted effort to organize a consistent approach in supporting local governments by several local Ham organizations including Des Plaines, Lake County, Hoffman Estates, Schaumburg, and DuPage County. There is a need for a common understanding of the protocols used by local government entities who call upon the Ham Radio community for support during emergency situations.

We are currently familiarizing ourselves with the newly-installed government officials in Schaumburg for the various entities such as Village Administration, Park District, Police, Fire Department, and Township Library.

John's organization of SARC's 24-person support for the recent Chicagoland Marathon was acknowledged by Schaumburg Village Police Chief Bill Wolf. The Village sent written correspondence to John presenting thanks for our club's successful contribution to the event. Repeaters:

Rob N9MVO and Bruce Warrington N9EHA discussed some of the possibilities surrounding the antenna installation on top of the Schaumburg Road Water Tower: Kent W9KAO previously reported occasional static similar to wet and/or windy weather possibly originating within the Station Master antenna. Since the antenna is more than 20-years old, it's possible there may be lightning damage to the structure or cabling. Maybe we could recruit a club member with Drone Photography capability to make a cursory survey of the tank's top. Bruce described his experience years ago in climbing the tower for installation and related there is a flat area beyond the convex top where the welded anchoring can be accessed safely if there is need to replace the antenna. While expense of a new Station Master could be substantial (~\$1K?) we

may not be required to hire professional antenna installation talent. The 440 machine is currently running 20 Watts and there may be a need for a new linear; coverage seems adequate at the moment but future expenditure may be needed to beef-up our signal.
